In 1972, Susan Giesbrecht joined friends Linie Friesen, Selma Loewen, and Sara Stoesz to open up the very first MCC Thrift Shop in Altona, Manitoba. They had an expectation that the project might last just three to six months. But instead, the shop began to thrive, and produced about \$1,000 for MCC during the first six months of operation. That vision for turning used clothing and household items into funds that support the mission of MCC has grown to be a thriving network of more than 85 shops in Canada and the US, providing millions of dollars each year for MCC's work at home and around the world.
