Responsibilities

Overall

- Develop awareness of and rationale for mentoring relationships in the congregation. Interpret to the congregation the need for this approach in ministry with the youth.
- Match all young persons entering grade seven (or at other time designated by the congregation) and check with other youth who are new to the congregation or who chose not to participate earlier to invite/re-invite their involvement.
- Plan at least two training & check-in sessions for mentors each year.
- Check in personally (telephone, in person, etc.) with each mentor periodically to listen and assess feelings related to the mentoring relationship; provide needed counsel and affirmation.
- Coordinate the annual covenant development/renewal at the beginning of each year (September).
- Coordinate with worship committee and/or the pastors to incorporate a time of affirmation for all youth-mentor pairs during a worship service in early Fall.
- Coordinate an annual evaluation process for each mentor-youth pair until the youth completes high school.
- Arrange for the planning of 2-3 group activities each year with all of the mentor-youth pairs. Coordinate this with the schedule of regular youth events.
- Arrange for occasional reporting to the congregation through personal sharing of experiences, notes in congregational newsletters, announcements in church bulletin, involvement in worship, etc.
